










## Usha Subramaniam Deputy Resident Representative, Hanns Seidel Foundation



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






# Dr. Helmut Brand Director, Prasanna School of Public Health Manipal Academy of Higher Education












#### Dr. Venkatesh Murthy Department of Social Work, Bengaluru University





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






#### Kartik Verma Core Team Member, Piramal School of Leadership








## Rashmi Samant Managing Director, AATMAH Foundation
